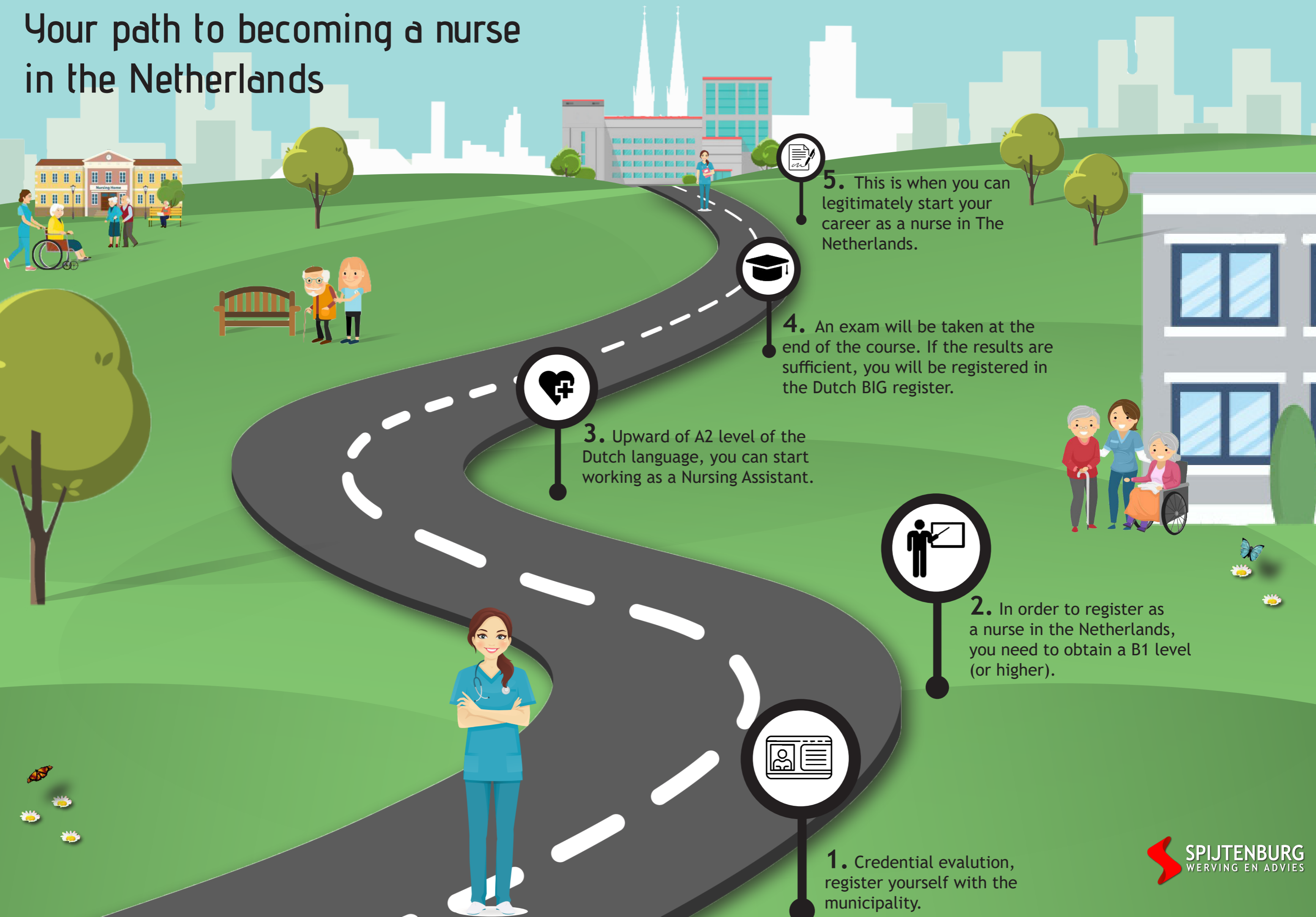


# Your path to becoming a nurse in the Netherlands

# Becoming a nurse in the Netherlands

Are you looking for a new challenge or a fresh start in elderly care? Are you a qualified nurse? We might just have a great opportunity for you in the Netherlands! Many healthcare institutions are looking for nurses with a passion for their job.



Before you can start working as a nurse in the Netherlands you need to validate your diploma with Nuffic or IDW. You will also have to register yourself with the municipality in order to get your citizen service number (BSN).

If you're from a non-EU country, you will need a work and residence permit to work as a nurse in the Netherlands.

We will guide you in this process.

In order to register as a nurse in the Netherlands you need to obtain a B1 level (or higher). This has to be on all four areas: listening, reading, speaking and writing.



Therefore, you will start a language course, which will take about three to six months (depending on your current experience). You have the possibility to follow the language course online from your current place of residence.

Depending on your knowledge, upward of A2 level, you are able to work as a Nursing Assistant in elderly care during your language course.

This gives you the opportunity to get to know our Dutch healthcare system and will help you to master your Dutch language skills.



An exam will be taken at the end of your language course. If the results are sufficient, you will receive a certificate. With this certificate you can register yourself in the Dutch BIG register. This allows you to use the legally protected title belonging to your profession.



Being registered in this list is necessary for working as a nurse in the Netherlands.
